Innovative Teaching Methodologies in Hospitality Schools for Inclusive Education



ABOUT THE PROJECT

The InTeam4IEd project aims to support teachers and tutors in dealing with developmental challenges associated with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) students of post-secondary (initial) VET in the hospitality sector, as well as to assist them in acquiring expendable skills both within the education system and externally in the hospitality industry.

Inclusive education of people with Special Educational Needs (SEN) is often framed in terms of human rights or justice. Notwithstanding, the economic dimension for educating people with disabilities is also very relevant. Lack of appropriate education remains the key risk factor for poverty and exclusion of any person, whether they are disabled or not.

This project follows a follow a step-by-step methodology based on the Plan-Do-Check-Act Cycle (PDCA) to create a ground-breaking Flexible and Hybrid Educational Methodology and Tools (F.H.E.M.T.) for teachers to assist ASD students in gaining new sector-specific competencies, and also an educational application, which will integrate the F.H.E.M.T., and the related operational guidelines for teachers, students and families.

On the 15th and 16th of December 2022, the second Transnational Partner's Meeting was hosted by MILITOS in Athens, Greece! During this meeting, we mainly discussed the structure of the InTeaM4IEd Skills and Competences Model and defined how to arrange and distribute the data collected from the national interviews, skills and competences, as well as the development of real-life scenarios within the hospitality sector. Project partners also made an overview of the existing specific teaching methods and tools, learning approaches and challenges for students with ASD in their respective countries, which will be gathered into a Compendium. Some inputs for the Flexible and Hybrid Teaching Methodologies and Tools for ASD students were also shared. Finally, we had the opportunity to hear Mr. Alberto Gutiérrez, founder/project manager of the "Autism Friendly Club", which aims to identify and certify accessible spaces and environments for people with ASD.

InTeaM4IEd Skills and Competences Model

Our Consortium has developed the "InTeaM4IEd Skills and Competences in the Hospitality Sector Model", which offers the possibility to teachers, educators, trainers and also employers of the hospitality industry to learn how to deal with developmental challenges associated with ASD students, guiding them through a step-by-step approach (tailored to the individual's learning requirements and characteristics) aimed to strengthen those skills. Facilitating, in this way, the learners' integration within and outside the school system, resulting in the development of capable professional figures employable in the hospitality sector.
